Bird Identification. Where to Begin. A thirty-year veteran birder and guide, Susan Foster will offer tips and advice on how you can begin to identify and more importantly, to enjoy, the world of birds around you. Some simple steps, hints, and pointers will get you started knowing the birds. Where to go, when to go, and what you need to be successful will also be discussed.

Susan Foster is a retired teacher and spends most of her time in the pursuit of all things birds. She spent 30 years as a resident of Laredo, Texas, enjoying the unique avifauna of the Texas/Mexican border. In the past decade or two, she has led bird tours in and around South Texas for the Rio Grande Valley Birding Festival, Laredo Birding Festival, Rockport HummerBird Festival, the Aransas Bird and Nature Club, the Audubon Outdoor Club, The Birdiest Festival, and the Texas Ornithological Society, as well as given presentations on eBird for the Aspen Center for Environmental Studies. She was a founding member of the Monte Mucho



Audubon Society and is currently secretary of the Aransas Bird and Nature Club as well as a Regional Director of the Texas Ornithological Society. Originally from Massachusetts, she spends her time birding in Colorado in the summer and all around Texas and beyond the remainder of the year. Susan currently lives on the coast in Rockport, Texas.
